Why is it important?

Joined-up governance for fundamental rights helps public officials coordinate their work across levels of government. It is a working method to coordinate the efforts of governments, international organisations, human rights bodies and civil society.

By 'joining' together officials can further improve fundamental rights' protection and promotion. They can:

- Improve the impact of project results
- Avoid errors and duplication of efforts
- Encourage innovation and coordination
- Raise fundamental rights awareness
- Enhance accountability and transparency
